

Black History Month

Back in October, for part of our celebration of Black History Month, year 8 visited the Palace Theatre in Newark for a special talk. They had a great time attending a talk by Paul Crooks, a Black History expert, on significant black leaders in History before the era of the Transatlantic Slave Trade.

Students heard the untold stories of Black men who inspired generations, their enduring impact on society, and their courage and resilience. Thank you to Paul for sharing these important stories with our students.



A group of our students worked with Inspire Youth Arts and Urban Projections across several weeks to create 'Fallen From The Same Tree', a stunning light and sound installation themed around woodland and our relationship to the forest, drawing on feelings of community, family and connection to each other.

Mrs Thacker, who helped aide the project, said: "I am absolutely thrilled that the students of Magnus were given this opportunity to create an interactive exhibition that the people of Newark were able to enjoy. I'm also incredibly proud of how our talented creatives responded to the brief, whilst recognising how fortunate they were to have benefited from working alongside two inspirational artists – Rebecca Smith and John Sampson. We hope the town enjoyed the experience of 'Fallen from the Same Tree' – as much as we loved creating it."

Year 7 Author Visit

We were proud to be able to gift our Year 7 students a book again this Christmas and we hope it will encourage them to keep reading through their time here at Magnus.

Each year, we gift a book to every Year 7 because we feel reading is such a vital part of a student's progression during their time in school and this falls in line with our vision is to develop people of good character. This year's book, When Things Went Wild is written by Tom Mitchell and we were thrilled to have him join us for the event and to talk to Year 7 about his experiences as an author.

The impact reading can have on our students is invaulable and we feel it's important that they get the opportunity to hear from a published author, to understand what inspired them, see where that creativity stems from and where that creativity can lead.

We are proud of the attitudes and behaviour of Year 7 throughout the event and very impressed with the questions they had to ask Tom after his talk.

Piano Masterclass & Concert

Students attended a musical performance at St Mary Magdalene Church, Newark, followed by a masterclass in composition given by local pianist and composer, Chris Miggells.

performance, Chris joined students at Magnus where young musicians were able to engage with him directly in an exploration of music and the music industry.

Known for his innovative approach, Chris guided students to construct melodies inspired by colours and scenic imagery. Chris said he was pleased to be able to share his expertise with students. Remembrance Service

They lay beneath the Rolls of Honour which display the names of former Magnus students that fought, and lost their lives, in WWI and WWII.

This year, our focus was on service and remembering that 2023 marks 60 years since the end of National Service in our country. Our Head Students read passages and poems, representatives from HOPE read prayers and Mrs Ranger led us in a reflection of what it means to serve others.



Duke of Edinburgh

The Duke of Edinburgh award has relaunched for the 2023/24 school year at Magnus with the largest cohort of Bronze candidates so far.

31 Year 9 students have chosen to take part in the award, and have already been out on their first, rather wet and muddy, navigation training walk. Another training walk and two overnight expeditions are still to follow in half terms 4 and 6. Good luck to them!
